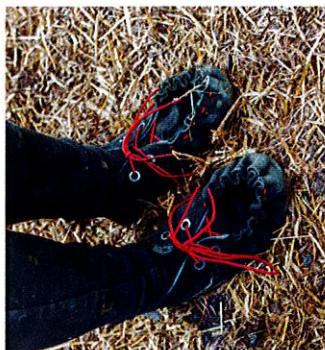


# What To Bring On A Shearing Course?



- Shearing trousers, work trousers or jeans, **no Shorts or Skirts.**
- Shearing vest or polo type shirt. Sweat shirt or pullover type to wear when not shearing.

- A change of clothes is recommended at the end of the day.
  - Shearing Mocs, or flat soled trainer type shoe.
  - **No steal toe caps.**

# What To Bring On A Shearing Course?



We know that purchasing all the right equipment and clothing prior to your course can be daunting and expensive. But we request that you follow our guidelines for suitable alternatives. R Schofield, Shearing Manager.

Please bring all food and drink required along with you for the duration of your course, as there are no catering facilities provided at any of our venues. As shearing can be strenuous we recommend that you stay well-hydrated with plenty of water.

We ask that you wear clean clothing to arrive and depart from the venue. We recommend shearing trousers or Jeans, **please do NOT wear shorts, skirts or loose clothing**. Ideally, footwear should be moccasins, if not a flat plimsol type shoe – **NO heels or steel toe caps**. Plus a layer for warmth whilst not shearing. Please also take into consideration the weather and dress accordingly.

- A serviceable handpiece with worm/ spline drive. Solid ferrule for the handpiece.
- Preferably, 2 to 6 Clean sharp combs with **NO broken teeth**, Short Bevel 88 to 94mm & 4 to 12 Cutters. Alternatively, we ask everyone to bring a couple of sets of 93mm Short Bevel combs or the equivalent, and cutters (1 comb and 2 cutters is one set).
- If you are unable to obtain a handpiece you could contact the course instructor to discuss loan options.



- Instructor details will be on your booking confirmation email.
- PLEASE NOTE: Any borrowed equipment is the private property of the instructor. Should this equipment become damaged, it must be reimbursed/ compensated for. This agreement is between the Instructor and Trainee.
- **Please bring with you some identification on the courses.**
