A basic kit of materials to get you up and going is listed here.

Specialist art shops are the best option and will provide student discounts if you mention that you are attending the school. The recommended stores are:

- **Studio Art Supplies** - Crummer Road, Grey Lynn.
 - **The French Art Shop** – Taylors Road, Morningside
 - **Gordon Harris** - Gillies Avenue, Newmarket and Symonds Street, Auckland Central
 - **Takapuna Art Supplies** - Takapuna
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- Pencils or charcoal.
- Palette – wood or plastic (flat to enable mixing)
- Palette knife (with elbow rather than flat)
- Preferred brushes, preferably synthetic, flat or filbert, various sizes including one 2cm wide
- A3 or A4 canvas, canvas boards, MDF, hardboard or heavy card... primed/sized and ready
- An old shirt or apron
- **Essential** Oil paints:
- White (Titanium, Zinc or any other)
- Burnt Umber
- Alizarin Crimson
- Ultramarine Blue
- Cadmium Yellow (or hue)
- **Optional** Oil paints:
- Cobalt Blue (hue)
- Cadmium Red (hue)
- Prussian Blue or Pthalo Blue
- Raw Umber
