Travelling to the AWRC

Active Travel and Public Transport

We encourage people to actively travel to the AWRC either by walking cycling or using public transport where possible.

By Train

The nearest train stations are Meadowhall (2.6 miles) and Sheffield Centre (2.6 miles)

By Tram

The local tram route is the yellow route. The nearest tram stop is Arena/Olympic Legacy Park (7 minute walk).

1. From the tram stop follow the path towards the English Institute of Sport (EIS) building.
2. Cross Coleridge Road and continue on the path with the EIS to your right onto Old Hall Road.
3. Continue past the UTC College Building and the AWRC is straight ahead.

By Bicycle

There is a cycle store on site, places are limited and allocated on a first come first served basis. There is additional cycle parking outdoors.

By Bus

There are bus stops directly in front of the AWRC on Attercliffe Common.

- Heading towards Sheffield City Centre the stop is Attercliffe Common/Fell Road
- Heading towards Meadowhall the stop is Attercliffe Common/Clay Street

Directions

The AWRC is located just a 10 minute drive from J34 of the M1 and a 15 minute drive from Sheffield city centre.

From Attercliffe Common, turn onto Worksop Road, take the third left into the Park Community Arena car park.



Parking is extremely limited across the Sheffield Olympic Legacy Park and therefore travelling by public transport and active travel is strongly encouraged

Car Parking

The AWRC is served by two car parks:

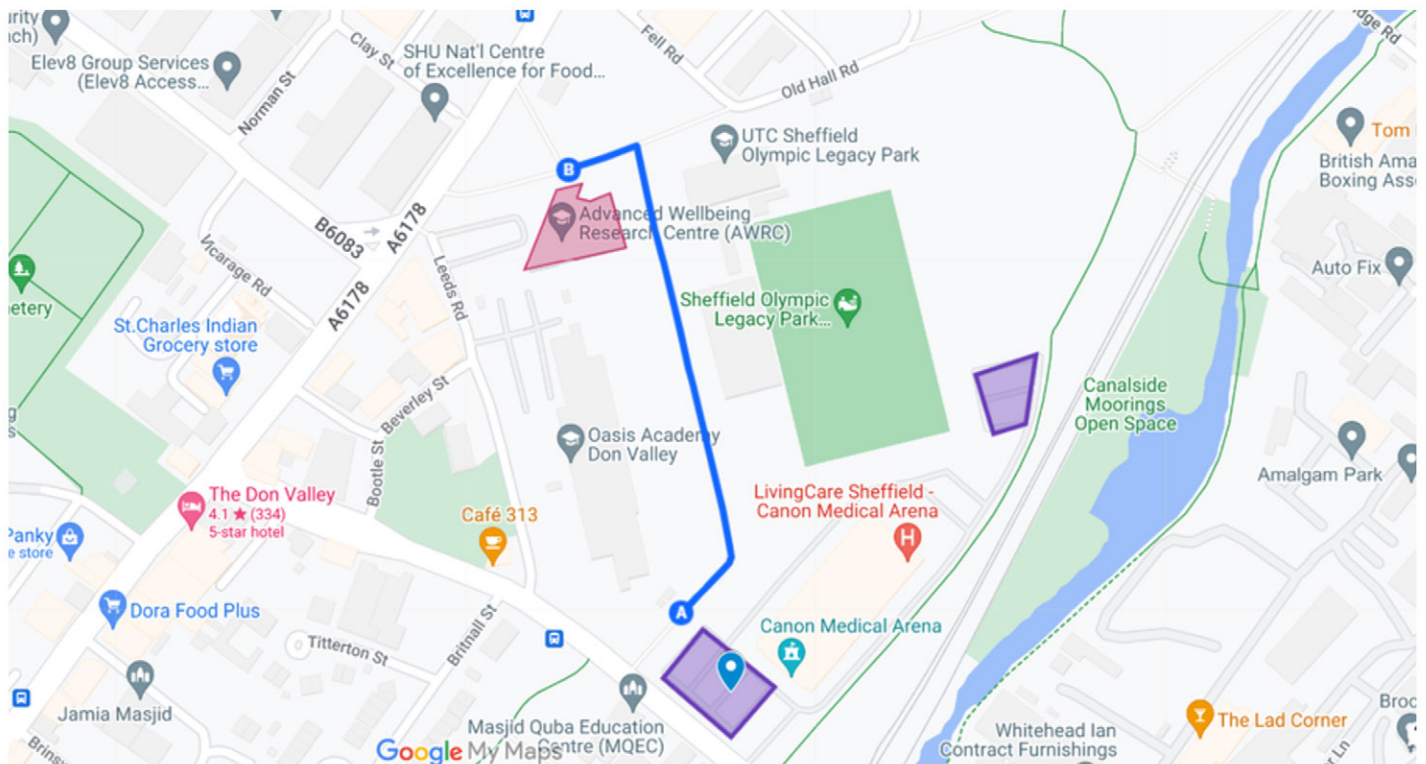
Worksop Road (staff and visitor) car park: S9 3TY

Leeds Road (staff and patient) car park: S9 3TU

Both car parks have two hours free parking



If you are staying for longer than two hours, ensure you register your car details at reception to avoid any penalty charges* (ANPR system in operation)



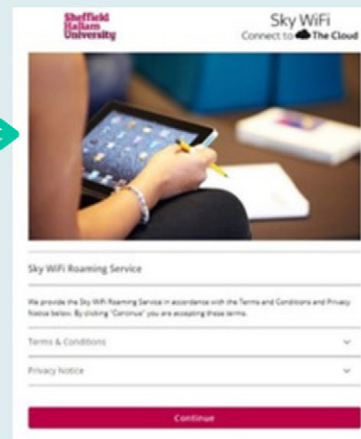

IT Guidance

WiFi

We advise external users to use WIFI Guest

- Please connect and then open a web browser
- You will then be directed to this page →
- Click 'Continue' and then 'Create account'
- You can use these credentials on your other devices
- You only need to register once
- Your device will automatically connect on future visits (and at other SHU sites)
- Do NOT use SHU-GUEST



Laptops

Please ensure that your laptop has all recent Windows Updates applied (if updates are not applied, then you will **NOT** be able to connect to WIFI Guest)

SHU pc

In order to use a SHU device you will need a SHU Guest login account which can be requested (awrcoperations@shu.ac.uk). These need to be requested a minimum of 48 hours in advance.

Video Conferencing

In order to use the video conferencing equipment in the room, you will need to be logged onto a SHU device. As above, a SHU Guest login will be necessary.

If you wish to share material online – you will need bring this on a flash drive/USB memory stick

Fire Alarms and assembly point
