




## SIERRA27 – Course Key Information

### Level 3 Award in First Response Emergency Care (RQF).

#### Venue & Transport

- **Location:** Apollo Business Village, Aberkenfig, Bridgend CF32 9RF
- **Parking:** Available on site
- **Public Transport:** Sarn train station (7-minute walk), nearby bus stops
- **Google Maps:** Recommended for directions and public transport options



## Course Schedule & Format

- **Dates:** As stated on your booking confirmation email
- **Duration:** 5 days
- **Daily Timings:** 09:00 start, 17:00 finish
- **Attendance:** Mandatory for all sessions; no exceptions for late arrival or early departure
- **Intended audience:** This qualification is for people with a specific responsibility at work or in voluntary and community activities to provide prehospital care to patients requiring emergency care/treatment. It is ideal for those looking to progress their careers within the emergency services, ambulance services, and healthcare settings. It supports specialist medical roles within law enforcement and security, energy and utilities, construction, and the military.

## Qualification & Entry Requirements

- **Qualification overview:** This qualification forms part of the QA Prehospital Care suite of qualifications. The qualification and learning outcomes are based on the recommendations of:
  - Resuscitation Council (UK)
  - Assessment Principles for Regulated First Aid Qualifications
  - The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh – Faculty of Pre-Hospital Care (FPHC)
- **This QA qualification is:** For people who work or hope to work as first-response emergency care providers in various job sectors.
  - Based on the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) training standard for delivery of First Aid at Work (FAW) courses for the Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981
  - This qualification should give the Learner the knowledge and skills associated with Level D of the FPHC Pre-Hospital Emergency Medicine (PHEM) skills framework to handle various prehospital emergency care situations.
- **Objective:** The objective of the qualification is to benefit Learners by enabling them to attain the knowledge and practical competencies needed to deal with a range of prehospital emergency care situations
- **Age:** 17+
- **Language:** Course delivered in English; Level 1 English assessment required before starting

## Assessments

- **Practical assessments** – observed by the Trainer throughout the course, with the results of each learning outcome recorded on the practical assessment

paperwork, see QA Guide to Assessing Qualsafe Level 3 Award in First Response Emergency Care (RQF). There are 6 mandatory and 5 optional practical assessments for this qualification:

- **Mandatory:**
  - 1. Adult basic life support
  - 2. Child basic life support
  - 3. Infant basic life support
  - 4. Airway and ventilation skills
  - 5. Prehospital emergency trauma care
  - 6. Prehospital emergency medical care
- **Optional:**
  - 1. Supraglottic airway device
  - 2. Inhaled analgesia (Nitrous Oxide)
  - 3. Inhaled analgesia (Penthrox)
  - 4. Administration of naloxone
  - 5. Blood glucose measurement
- **Theory assessments:**
- **Invigilated exam:** has a pass mark of 16 out of 21 questions and a maximum time of 30 minutes to complete.
  - Multiple choice question paper – 1 paper for each Learner and Learners should answer all the questions under ‘examination’ conditions.
  - Maximum time allowed for the multiple-choice question paper is 60 minutes, the minimum mark is 28 out of 40 to be considered for an overall ‘Pass’
  - There are 2 possible grades available of Pass or Fail.

All mandatory areas of assessment must individually meet or exceed the required pass criteria/mark for the Learner to achieve this qualification.

- **Recording:** Practical assessments are video recorded for audit purposes

## What to Bring

- **Equipment Provided:** Manual (available for purchase), pens, pencils, notepaper

- **Recommended:** Comfortable clothing (trousers and flat shoes)
- **Identification:** Valid photo ID (passport, UK driving licence, etc.)
- **Proof of Address:** Two documents from the approved list (bank statement, utility bill, council tax, etc.)

## Language Prerequisite

- Must demonstrate English/Welsh language skills equivalent to B2 CEFR or Level 1 Functional Skills/ESOL

## Special Considerations
